NOTES FROM THE DIRECTORS...

Many things seem to be happening all at once here at IIEI. It's very hard to keep track of just how fast we are growing. Here are just a few of the changes and additions

Very shortly we will have our very own bulletin board and Internet web site. Though two completely separate items, they give us immediate access to our growing membership. Dr. Gerry Bedore is heading the effort with many people involved, one of whom, Bob Irons (one of our interns), already has an HEI web page that he has completed as a student project.

This is our first full-blown newsletter. The circulation is growing. Copies of this newsletter are being sent literally "all over the world." HEI is growing rapidly. Memberships are continuing to be received on a daily basis as more and more of the import-export community hears of our existence.

Our first global test date is coming up soon: September 7, 1996. Exams are scheduled semiannually with the next testing date being March 8, 1997. If you weren't able to order your test before the deadline passed for September, it won't be long until March is here. This will give you extra time to study. Those of you who enrolled in an IIEI co-sponsored program in your local communities may have different test dates. Contact your school officials for time and location. For those of you who reside outside the United States, the earlier you notify us of your intention to take the certification exam, the better. For all testing sites, however, it is critical that you list several local colleges and universities so that we can be sure to secure a test site for you.

Our internship program continues to grow. One new aspect of the internships is that we are now able to work with colleges and universities in "for-credit" internships. The requirements deemed appropriate by the institution will be monitored by our Director of Interns. If you are interested in "for-credit" internships, please have your school contact John Granillo at IIEI directly.

The Certificates issued to those passing the exams have a new look and feel. Comments from the recipients have been very positive.

Local Chapters Forming

Continuing IIEI's tradition of networking and developing ties within the import-export community, three new chapters are forming. These chapters, two in the Phoenix, Arizona area, are being formed to meet the growing demand locally among new members. Also, a chapter is in the early formation stages in Dallas, Texas to accommodate the ever increasing numbers of IIEI members there.

IIEI is pleased to welcome all the new members at the University of Phoenix, Arizona State University's School of Business International MBA Association, and all those in Dallas.

A chapter may be formed with as few as ten starting members. You can be located anywhere in the world. A chapter organization is not only a great way to network with industry people, it aids in fostering international activities in your area.

New Programs Aimed at Colleges and Universities Unveiled

In a recent interview, Dr. Gerry Bedore, Executive Director and head of HEI's educational programs, announced that HEI's program and educational materials will be ready for use by member colleges and universities in the first quarter of 1997.

These programs include corporate education offerings such as certificate programs, customized undergraduate degree emphasis, and in late 1997 IIEI expects to have ready its graduate level degree emphasis. All of these programs are tailored to each institution's needs. Dr. Bedore said the corporate education and undergraduate programs can be ready for institutional use within about four months from date of commitment. He further stated that in addition to curriculum and supporting materials, IIEI can train, as needed, the institution's staff for delivery of the program.

Certified Export Specialist

- + successful completion of the exam
- + involved primarily in one or two aspects of import/ export operations, i.e. customs, export documentation, export financing
- + no letters of recommendation required.
- + no resume required

emilied Export Probasion

- + successful completion of the exam
- + involved in many aspects of import/export.
- + requires mastery of entire international arena
- + two years work experience
- + resume and two letters of recommendation required

- + successful completion of exam
- + involved in the management of the import/export functions within a firm, including strategic planning and market development
- + five years work experience
- + resume and three letters of recommendation required
- Certified Export Manager
- + successful completion of the exam
- + a person trained and certified by IIEI as an instructor or/ and instructor trainer


